Formalising RAW

It has been decided that RAW Energy should become an incorporated association so moves are afoot to bring this about. Office bearers and committee members have self-nominated and are in the process of formalising RAW as a legal entity. This is to enhance our ability to connect with the local community and position RAW to participate in community renewable energy projects locally.

Wodonga Community Solar Project

The team from Moreland Energy Foundation MEFL is continuing to develop a business case for the Wodonga Community Solar Project. There is a lot going on behind the scenes with ongoing conversations with North East Water and Ausnet Services.

We have also met with two of the directors from the Border Trust to gain an insight into their organisation and to see if there were any potential partnerships that may be had. We discovered many shared values and recognise there is a lot to learn from such a credible and established local organisation. The connection with BT has certainly been worthwhile and we will continue the conversation with them.

Inquiry into community energy projects

Community involvement should be one of the criteria that the Victorian government uses to evaluate bids received through its imminent renewables reverse-auction scheme, a state parliamentary inquiry has recommended.
